PASTORAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE UPDATE APRIL 2021

At present the PRC is assisting 3 Churches to call a Minister or Ministry Agent - the process mentioned in the last update. Representatives from PRC assist by attending meetings of the congregation and then convene the meetings with the Joint Nominating Committee (JNC) and the prospective Minister(s).





At other times, the PRC rep may attend Church Council meetings to give support to a congregation. Building relationships and trust is a big part of assisting Ministers and Congregations.

The Lay Preachers List has been updated and Mr Barry Cupitt of Miranda has been appointed as Convenor of the Lay Preacher's Committee. We thank Barry for his ongoing work in this area. There is an accreditation available for those interested in becoming an Accredited Lay Preacher. Please contact the office for more information.

Mrs Christine Gordon and Rev Michael Barnes have been appointed to the GRP Candidates Committee. We thank them for their time and dedication to the formation of new ministers which is so important to the Uniting church and the future of God's mission.

PRESBYTERY PROPERTY COMMITTEE UPDATE APRIL 2021

Some of the activities that the property committee has been involved with: -


- Clearing out the office at 2/598-602 Forest Rd Penshurst is complete. The remaining furniture is a Desk with separate return, three upholstered chairs and two coffee tables are available for a small donation. Contact the Presbytery Office to arrange an inspection.
- Recent heavy rains have caused roof leaks at the house at 2a Yeran St Sylvania. Quotes are being obtained.
- Considerable work is required to the South Hurstville church, including repairing roof leaks. Quotes are being sought.
- The sale of two church properties at Penshurst and Riverwood are well advanced and we expect the proceeds received from the sales will meet the target stated in the "Stage 1 Road Map for Mission in Georges River Presbytery utilising Property under its Stewardship".
- The former Presbytery office at Penshurst will be rented.
- The NSW government program to convert twin fluorescent lights to LED's is underway. Beverly Hills hall lights have been upgraded and the Mortdale church and hall upgrade is partially complete. The upgrades will reduce electricity consumption and costs. The cost is \$33 per site. Contact the Presbytery office for further information for your congregation.
- Renovating the house at 1 Winter Place Oatley is almost finished.

MISSION & STRATEGY COMMITTEE MEETING MAY 2021

The committee shared the updates of mission planning with congregations, discussed the missional aspirations of the new budget, particularly plans to establish new youth and fresh expression ministries at strategic areas of Presbyteries.

The two main Presbytery gatherings for the next two months are confirmed:

 Multicultural Worship Celebration marking the anniversary of the Uniting Church will take place at Bankstown UC on Saturday 26th June, 5 pm. This special worship service will reaffirm and celebrate our unique identity as an intercultural, cross-cultural, and





intergenerational church. We encourage members to register and participate on this special occasion.

• 'New Growth' Mission Day is confirmed to take place at Jannali Uniting Church on Saturday 31st of July, 2 pm-4.30 pm. This Mission Day looks to explore new ways of engaging in mission, growing our congregations in ways that include the impact in local communities, discipleship, numbers, etc.

PRESBYTERY YOUTH: LIVING STREAMS IN CHRIST (LSiC)

The LSiC Working Group are working hard to achieve their goals in promoting and growing the youth and young adult ministry in the Presbytery. They have taken on the role of organizing and promoting the Presbytery Multicultural worship event. They have youth gatherings planned for the next few months:



GLOBAL CLIMATE STRIKE




NETWORKING AND BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS


As with the Aboriginal Kurrunulla Centre, we are also reaching out and building relationships with organizations around us to serve our local communities. One such organization is the Advance Diversity Services (formerly known as Migrant Resource Centre). They are one of our neighbors across the road on The Avenue, Hurstville. The Presbytery staff had an informal meeting with ADS sharing common ways of serving the community, especially those who are disadvantaged. ADS is a non-profit organization whose role is to build community, bring cultures together, and promotes justice, equality, and respect. They provide a range of community, aged care, family, disability, and settlement services to enhance the health, wellbeing, and community connections of individuals and families in St George, the Sutherland Shire, and inner Sydney. They already have a connection with some of our congregations and members like The Storehouse at Kogarah, Rockdale UC, and Ruth Fyfe is their Chairperson of the Board.






THOUGHTS by Mary Pearson

We have come to the long season of Pentecost. In some ways it seems strange that this is just one season of the Church's year because we know that the Spirit has been present since the very beginning of everything, "hovering over the waters" in the darkness before the writer of Genesis describes the start of Creation, which continues always. The Spirit in Hebrew is named as "ruach", the breath of God. It is breath that brings and sustains life. At the beginning of John's gospel, we hear about the Word that spoke creation into being, the Word that is then identified with the person of Jesus who embodied it. He is the Word that brought life and light into the darkness of existence. We can see in these roles that intimately weave into the Trinity: Creator, Son and Spirit. This all calls us back to the core of our own being, as we see that the source and heart of all life comes from beyond us but is a gift of grace and truth to which we are all connected, to one another and to all creation. We are bound together in relationship.

These are concepts that we do not need to try and rationalize. Rather they can open us up to wonder. When we can let go of thinking we need to control everything and broaden our outlook, we see things that we often miss. We also glimpse that there is far more going on around us than we think. The intricacy of creation is way beyond our understanding. David Attenborough and others bring us images that astound us. The scientists interpret the workings of the world in ways that indicate how much there is still to learn and how extraordinary the world is. Thinking about the role we play in our small lives calls for humility and openness to wonder, to discerning how we can be part of the Spirit's ongoing work. Fortunately, we are all given glimpses of how God works happens in and around us - those things we may name a coincidence, but are they? How about the times when you suddenly feel you need to phone someone you have not been in touch with for a while and you do, only to hear them tell you they had just been hoping, praying that you would get in touch? What about the times when you have been wondering what to do, when things feel blocked, and then something unforeseen happens and everything falls into place? How about the many stories of someone who, for instance, did not have enough money to pay the rent or an overdue bill and then are unexpectedly given a gift of just the right amount. There are countless such stories, yet we so easily become overwhelmed in our lives by what seems like impossibility because we are trying to drive things in our own way. Of course, there are not always solutions like this. The Spirit is not at our beck and call - it blows were it wills, yet it moves in and around us always with a breath of love that breaks through our misunderstandings and draws us together if we are open to it and to each other.

The celebration of the day of Pentecost may have past, but the work of the Spirit, in the love of Christ continues. Here is a Pentecost poem from Malcolm Guite, a poem for everyday:





Today we feel the wind beneath our wings
Today the hidden fountain flows and plays
Today the church draws breath at last and sings
As every flame becomes a Tongue of praise.
This is the feast of fire, air, and water
Poured out and breathed and kindled into earth.
The earth herself awakens to her maker
And is translated out of death to birth.
The right words come today in their right order
And every word spells freedom and release
Today the gospel crosses every border
All tongues are loosened by the Prince of Peace
Today the lost are found in His translation.
Whose mother-tongue is Love, in every nation.
