

WITH A NEW MISSION PLAN, OFFICE, AND BRANDING, GEORGES RIVER PRESBYTERY ARE EMBARKING ON AN AMBITIOUS NEW AGENDA. THE PRESBYTERY SAY THAT THEY ARE WORKING TO REVERSE A DECLINE IN NUMBERS AND TO ENHANCE THEIR MINISTRY. *INSIGHTS* SPOKE TO PRESBYTERY MINISTER REV. MATAGI VILITAMA.

t the heart of Georges River Presbytery's new 'Mission, Vision and Strategic Plan 2020-2025' are aspirations to reverse a declining trend in numbers and to see what Presbytery Minister Rev. Matagi Vilitama calls "healthy, growing congregations that are known for passionately pursuing the mission of Jesus."

"This is the vision of the presbytery," Rev. Vilitama said.

The mission plan has a particular youth focus as well. In keeping with the Synod's vision of a Uniting Church that is 'growing young', Georges River Presbytery are seeking to support a youth movement in the Presbytery. This includes a working committee of young leaders and youth mentors who are leading the initiative.

"We are investing in growing multicultural and Crosscultural youth groups and training young leaders with the help of UME and Pulse," Rev. Vilitama said.

"We are also mentoring young people to participate in Presbytery committees and we are beginning to see positive response in this area."

Through UME, Synod has provided mission consultants to assist Georges River Presbytery in mission planning.

"The presence and support from Synod has helped build the relationship and collaboration between Presbytery and Synod. Rana Moawad from Synod assisted us in the details of the new logo and branding. Albert Olley, Chief Operating Officer of the Synod, represented Synod in the official opening of the new office."

#### **"THE NEW PLACE OF PRESBYTERY"**

The Presbytery Mission Day took place on Saturday 27 March. According to Rev. Vilitama, the day's main goal was the welcome new members to "the new place of Presbytery: not just in terms of our new office space but a new place in terms of mission."

"It was a day to mark a new beginning in the life of the Presbytery celebrating signs of new growth and hope," Rev. Vilitama said.

The Presbytery Mission Day had four objectives: To provide a time and space to physically meet for the first time since the COVID-19 lockdown, Sharing 'Good News' stories about mission events and projects in congregations and Presbytery groups, launching the Presbytery's new logo/brand, and the official opening of Presbytery's new office in Hurstville.

"There were four presentations on the day," Rev. Vilitama said.

"Presbytery Youth, known as 'Living Streams in Christ' (name that grew out of the logo referring to Georges river); Engadine Uniting Church shared their new mission in their local community, Cronulla New Beginnings Uniting Church talked about their new Discipleship project, and Carlton-Ramsgate Glee youth shared their experience of revitalising their youth group by reaching out to new families in the community."

According to Rev. Vilitama, it was, "All very inspiring and missional in focus."  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{C}}$

Moawad. As Rev. Vilitama explained, the logo has a rich symbolism that encompasses much of the new mission that Georges River Presbytery is embarking on.

"The name "Georges River" is aesthetically positioned with the image of a river inside a leaf flowing outwards. The symbols in the image are deeply theological.

Water is a biblical and theological concept that represents life. Jesus said, "I am the water of life...he who comes to me will never thirst..." Water in Baptism speaks about cleansing and new beginnings - a fresh start.

The leaf in this logo is a symbol of all of God's creation. Much of Georges River environment includes conservation parks and it's something that the Presbytery is very aware of."

"The leaf symbolises new life, growth and vitality. It is inclusive of food, medicine, art and culture; it speaks to God's providence and sustenance. Living in the Anthropocene calls us to care for God's creation and Climate Justice is at the heart of our eco-theology. It is integral to the mission of the UCA."

"Our young people are passionate about social justice and action on climate change. Engadine's Shane Slade for instance, a young leader in our Presbytery, is one of the faces of the Church advocating in the climate and social justice space."

"So these symbols of leaf and river, the colours green and blue are intentionally chosen to represent the ideals and aspirations of Georges River Presbytery reflected in the new Mission, Vision and Strategic Plan 2020-2025."


#### **STANDING COMMITTEE MEETING 5th AUGUST 2021**

The standing committee meet via zoom Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> August. The meeting received the following reports: Finance, Property, PRC, Chairperson, Mission & Leadership Presbytery Minister. The Standing Committee was updated on the progress for the implementation of the "EDRMS" (Electronic Document Records Management System), this included training for presbytery staff and committee chairpersons. The EDRMS provides a centralised system for storage of all the presbytery documents, this will create a more streamlined and secure system for the presbytery. The EDRMS is provided by the NSWACT Synod IT. As part of the roll out of the EDRMS all ministers within the presbytery will be/have been offered an "nswact.uca.org.au" email address. The Standing Committee resolved to change the time of its meeting to the second Tuesday of each month from 7pm till 9pm. This decision has been made to allow people in fulltime employment to attend the meetings.

The meeting of the presbytery was held via zoom Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> August. The keynote speaker for the meeting was Rev. Stu Cameron (CEO & Superintendent Wesley Mission). Stu gave a challenging and inspiring presentation of the work of Wesley Mission. As part of the presentation Stu also gave some very practical resources/information regarding church planting. The Pulse team presented the "Growing Young" program. The presbytery has been invited to participate in the growing young program, that seeks to revitalise congregations through ministry with younger generations. More information about the growing young program will be made available to the presbytery. The presbytery resolved to change its meeting dates to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday in November, February, May & August.

"Bread for the Journey" Romans 8:31-39 – no condemnation, no discouragement, no separation – we are conquerors through Christ who loves us and intercedes for us – difficulties will come and go but nothing can separate us from God's love – "The only thing to fear is fear itself" (Franklin D Roosevelt) - we have nothing to fear because we are in Christ and conquerors through Him who loves us.

- Supply Presbytery Pastoral Relations Minister: We look forward to a new Supply Minister in September to share his pastoral gifts with the GRP ministers and congregations.
- **Meeting times for PRC** (by Zoom at present) are under review in December to find a suitable time for those who are working nonflexible hours during the day. It was great to share with Helen Lee and Alisi Siakimotu in August when they usually must fit around work timing.
- We congratulate two members of PRC who were elected to Synod Standing Committee recently: Rev Simon Lee and Alisi Siakimotu. Their contribution to the Uniting Church ACT/NSW is a big responsibility in making decisions regarding the implementation of plans. The proposals approved at the recent Synod call for knowledge, skills, wisdom and faith from these representatives as they take their place on Synod Standing Committee. #### **PROPERTY COMMITTEE UPDATE AUGUST 2021**

- COVID restrictions have delayed all maintenance.
  - Some contractors can work within limits depending on many factors including the contractor's residential address in relation to the work site and vaccination status.
- Completion of the sales for the Penshurst and Riverwood property sales is expected in September.
- The process for leasing out the office at Penshurst is underway.
- Fire and other safety inspections are now routinely conducted, and remedial work is carried out following the inspection report recommendations
- The finishing touches to the renovations on the Manse at 1 Winter Place Oatley were delayed due to COVID restrictions, but hopefully will be made soon.
- We farewelled Helen Phillips after many years on the Property Committee; her input has been invaluable. We welcomed Hawea Jackson, and Jo Matagi as new committee members and we look forward to their contributions.

If anyone knows any reliable, accredited tradespeople, please let us know. We are compiling a directory to make it easier for Congregation Property Committees and Maintenance Teams (and the GRP Property Committee) to find suitable people. ### 'Global Leadership Summit' (GLS)





All over Australia, people of faith are hand-writing personal letters to our Prime Minister Scott Morrison asking for serious climate action. Will you join us?


The letters will be presented in one large stack to the Prime Minister by the Australian Religious Response to Climate Change after Friday 10th September, so we don't have long to get them posted!

#### **Knit for Climate Action**



Common Grace's <u>Knit for Climate Action</u> campaign focuses on 101 years of global warming, with knitters putting in countless hours to create these scarves clearly showcasing the rapid rise in temperature over the last 25 years to the alarming levels we are experiencing today. The presentation of scarves to the country's leaders on the occasion of the winter solstice marks the beginning of a campaign which will see scarves presented to all sitting members by the end of September 2021. The day in Canberra marked the culmination of hours of work done by members of congregations and individuals from many different denominations under the Common Grace umbrella. In the months to come, it is aimed to gift every Federal Member of Parliament and Senator with a scarf and a request to wear it in Parliament on the 21<sup>st</sup> October, which is the last day of sitting

of both houses of parliament before the UN Climate Change Conference in November.

Knitting the scarf was so popular amongst Engadine UC our older congregation members and gained them media exposure in both Eternity magazine and on ABC RN\* that we have had people asking whether we would sell the scarves or teach them to make one. We were hoping to hold workshops in person in order for people to come along and be supported in their knitting while talking about their own journey into climate awareness and their feelings about that, but of course that's not possible right now. Knitting online is a suitable activity but we're still working out how we can genuinely support people in making a scarf that requires very specific quantities and colours of wool, at a time when non-essential shopping is being discouraged. ### **Electronic Digital Records Management System (EDRMS)**

### Thoughts

A few months ago, things started opening up again but then all of a sudden, the Covid-19 Delta variant struck and here we are in lockdown again. What have we learned from the second lockdown experience? After sharing with friends and colleagues, most have experienced troubled mind, frustrations but also personal growth. There is dullness, sadness and lostness but also more closeness with God, resilience, and growth.

We all have experienced growing pains. When our faith is tested, it attracts God's power and brings his grace into our situations. He will fight for us on our battlefields, take us through our storms, and turn our seasons of trouble into seasons of growth. The Bible says, 'Even though Jesus was God's Son, he learned obedience from the things he suffered '(Hebrews 5:8). He knows what it is like to face challenges. And he is also present with us in our current lockdown and will be there in the future to strengthen and guide us when we face hardship and stormy seas. Being Christians does not mean we will be free from Covid - or any disease for that matter. Being Christ's disciples does not excuse us also from painful relational challenges or mental trauma or all kinds of trouble and battles. But God will help us get through them when they come. Consider what Paul went through, "...as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: in great endurance; in troubles, hardships and distresses; in beatings, imprisonments and riots; in hard work, sleepless nights and hunger..." (2 Corinthians 6:4-10). As we continue to experience this excruciating lockdown, know that God is our refuge. God is forever near and accessible to us. As Paul experienced suffering he also learnt endurance and growth. May we also lean on God and grow in faith, grow in every way during this time of hardship.


